WHAT: Topics of panel discussions will include various Indian land claims, tribal recognition, tribal sovereign immunity, The Indian Gaming Regulatory Act and tribal gambling expansion, fee-to-trust, States' rights, private property rights, Hawaii's Akaka bill, the Environmental Protection Agency's policy called "Treatment As States" (TAS), local small government impacts when tribal businesses refuse to collect or remit sales/excise taxes, and impacts upon adjacent small businesses when tribes open casinos and various other retail establishments. We'll also discuss "Political Action" and how to increase the effectiveness of your individual and our joint lobbying efforts locally and nationally. Kelly will discuss PACT’s pending lawsuit against the State of Oregon, since gambling is unconstitutional there. **Lyle Beckwith**, Senior Vice President of the National Association of Convenience Stores (NACS) of Alexandria, **Dan Gilligan**, President, Petroleum Marketers Assn. of America (PMAA), Arlington, VA, **Jim Lynch**, Federal Indian Policy historian and research consultant from Connecticut. Jim is also the author of a new book entitled: “By their free act & deed: Connecticut's Land Relationship with Indian Tribes 1496-2003”, **Lawrence M. Zaccaro** of Connecticut, author of the excellent new novel “Parallel”, **David Jaques**, President of One Nation United and Chairman of the Douglas County Planning Commission in Oregon. David wants to limit number of acres tribes can take into “trust” & off the tax rolls. **Pete Richards**, Legislative Director/Counsel, Office of Congressman Charles W. Dent, **Kathy McDonald** of KMAC & ASSOCIATES, Vancouver, WA, will address political issues.
